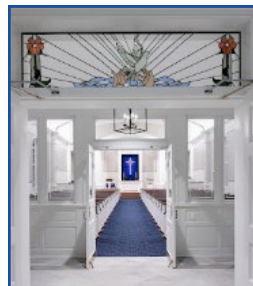

Friends of Luther Manor Annual Fundraising Campaign

For 60 years, Luther Manor’s not-for-profit, faith-based community has served older adults of all faiths. It has

independent living, a range of health services, including rehabilitation therapies, supportive living, assisted living, skilled nursing, and hospice care. You may not know that FPLC was instrumental in the founding of Luther Manor. In 1960 a committee studied the needs of the area’s older adults and how to meet them. They recommended building a care center to serve the greater Milwaukee area. A non-profit, faith-based organization was formed and things took off from there. Now Luther Manor has nearly 400 residents with 400 employees and 300 volunteers!

Who Are Friends of Luther Manor?

The Friends of Luther Manor, which has been in existence in various forms since 1961, helps grow the Resident Support Fund, for those who have outlived their savings. There is a gap between Medicaid and the actual cost of care for older adults. Medicaid only covers about 50% of the cost of care. By becoming a Friend, your gift will help bridge that gap.

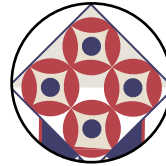
Women's Book Club
